## **Spooktastic Fabric Postcard Pattern**



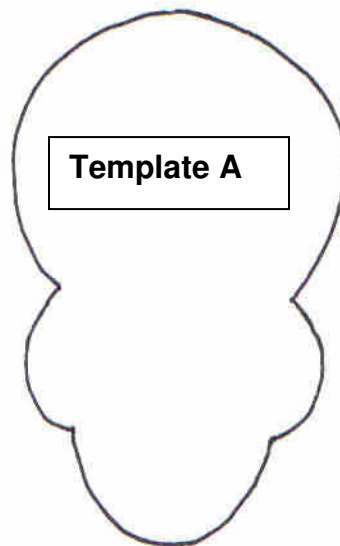

## **To Create the Spooktastic Fabric Postcard:**

1. Cut fabric pieces from the Template A skull shape. Experiment... the skulls can be arranged in lots of different ways. Keep flipping them around until you're happy!
  
2. ***If you like the arrangement shown in the photograph:***
  - A. Fuse Wonder Under to the back side of your fabrics.
  - B. Cut 5 skulls in fabrics of your choice from Template A, and cut a background fabric piece 4"x6".
  - C. Fuse the 4"x6" background fabric to the front side of your postcard.
  - D. Please refer to the full size picture for the Template A locations in order to arrange the design. The pieces will hang off the edge. Fuse the Template A skulls down.
  - E. Trim the edges back to your 4"x6" postcard size with your rotary cutter after you have fused the skulls down.
  - F. Hand embroider the "x" eyes, nose, and mouths as shown in the photo with embroidery floss. Alternatively, if you want to machine embroider the skull face features, a straight stitch could make the eyes and nose, and a large zig-zag stitch would make a great scary mouth!
  - G. Embellish, attach the back, finish the edges and go!
